About Our Heritage... Beginning in late November, images of Santa Claus appear everywhere in the United States, while other countries have their own version of the jolly old gift giver; but not everyone knows his origin dates back to Italy and San Nicolo di Bari. San Nicolo's image was transformed into the American Santa Claus. He was the patron saint of children, merchants and sailors. San Nicolo was said to have saved the life of a sailor on a voyage to Egypt. A more yuletide tale tells of him helping a poor man who couldn't afford dowries for his three daughters and was considering prostitution. Hearing this San Nicolo used some of his inherited wealth to help.



Late at night he would throw bags of gold through an open window, often landing in stockings hanging from the fireplace to dry. He had only given enough for two of the daughters before the poor man became suspicious. San Nicolo then dropped enough for the third daughter down the chimney.

As the Santa Claus myth grew, the character became unique to American culture and began to resemble San Nicolo less and less. He is said to have died on December 6, 343 A.D. and was laid to rest in the cathedral of Myra for seven hundred years until the city was conquered by the Turks. Sailors then arrived in Myra and stole the bones, returning them to Bari. His bones produced clear liquid (manna), which was said to have a healing power. San Nicolo di Bari left such a mark during his life that his deeds of kindness remain memorable through the centuries, regardless of how his image is portrayed.

Let us Never Forget our Servicemen and Service Women around the World serving our country to keep us all safe and free.




