

Lodge 2016 Survey Results

Overall, respondents are highly satisfied with the lodge, would recommend membership and currently attend meetings.

Dances still remain the most popular events, but suggestions have been made for more social nights, including trivia, karaoke, card nights, book club, and paint night. They'd also like to see more one-day outings, such as bus trips to casinos and Arthur Avenue. Most important criteria for attending functions include theme, cost, timeframe, and convenient location. Suggestions for improving events/functions are having more socials, spread out functions so that there aren't too many in one month. Reminder most lodge functions are open to non-members.

Respondents are extremely satisfied with La Voce and read it regularly. Additional features suggested include a Guess Who/Baby Pictures section, personal stories, more articles about Italian culture and more of the general membership in the picture section. Readers still prefer to receive La Voce via mail and generally don't access the Lodge's website or Facebook.

There is a consensus that we need to attract younger members. New members should be assigned a "mentor" to help them acclimate to the lodge, get involved and attend functions. Suggestions to improve the membership experience are increased access to upstairs, opening the bar on non-event nights and increased social nights.

Improvements to the monthly meetings include shortening the meeting, less business topics, and more time to socialize. Most respondents would prefer a 7 pm start time for meetings and events. Virtually all respondents are receiving phone tree messages, and no respondents require transportation.

Brumidi Catering received high marks and members would recommend to non-members as well as use for their own personal events. Suggestions to improve the catering business would be using social media to advertise, brightening the lobby, new paint, cleaning the drapes and doing more preventative building maintenance.

Thank you to those who took the time to complete the survey. A greater response rate to the survey in the future would ensure more of your opinions and views are voiced.
